Development Goal and Immediate Objectives

In line with the international, national and UN Country Team strategies for Iraq, this project is working towards the achievement of the following medium term outcomes:

- 1. Enhanced capacity of the SIEI/Ministry of Industry to respond to the needs of the manufacturing industry, service sector and consumers and facilitate industrial development in Iraq.
- 2. Industry has access to improved services that would enable precision manufacture and quality improvement of their products.

Outputs, Key Activities and Procurement

Outputs	 A comprehensive framework developed for the SIEI to support the development of the industries in Iraq through the provision of technical and information support, quality assurance and conformity assessment services (testing, inspection, certification, etc.). The managerial and technical staff of the SIEI has acquired the knowledge and skills to meet the needs of the manufacturing industry, service sector and consumers. The SIEI testing and calibration laboratories, production workshop and information facilities (library) are rehabilitated to adequately respond to the demands of the manufacturing industry, service sector and consumers.
Activities	 Policy, legal and regulatory framework: Under this component, the project will: Evaluate, review and update the policies and procedures that address the operation of the SIEI and its related activities and services (testing & calibration, product certification, import/export inspection, product design, training, etc.). Review and update the legal and regulatory framework covering the institutional setting

- and the mandate of SIEI, to fit the international best practice.
- Carry out a sensitization/awareness programme for representatives of SIEI/MoI, the
 public and private sector, and structures cooperating with SIEI (Central Organization for
 Standardization and Quality Control COSQC, etc.) on the role of standardization and
 conformity assessment in the compliance of local products with international standards
 and market requirements and protection of consumers from sub-standard products.
- Conduct a specific training programme for the SIEI/MoI, representatives of the Central Organization for Standardization and Quality Control (COSQC), and the private sector, on the dev. of national and int. standards, adaptation of international standards to local needs, and inspection and certification of industrial products and systems.
- Evaluate the internal and external communication policies of SIEI and develop: (i) recommendations to generate better understanding of the institute's objectives throughout the Iraqi industries; (ii) Publicity material (promotional brochures, web pages, etc.) aimed at increasing SIEI services visibility among consumers.

Capacity building – skills development: The project will allow for know-how transfer and training in quality (SMTQ), production and economy related areas to a substantial number of SIEI managerial and technical staff. The development of technical and managerial skills will focus on, but will not be limited to, the following areas:

- Knowledge and skills in the fields of standardization, quality assurance, and conformity assessment services (testing and material analysis, inspection, certification, etc.).
- Knowledge and skills in the fields of heat treatment, modern welding technologies, general industrial maintenance, and production workshop management, etc.
- Knowledge and skills in the fields of project management; preparing business plans and feasibility studies; network administration, etc.

Capacity building – SIEI facilities upgraded: The project will acquire appropriate equipment, instrumentation, and reference materials for the SIEI testing/calibration labs and production workshop, and assistance will be provided in preparing the laboratories towards international accreditation of their services. The project will further rehabilitate and provide the SIEI library with up-to-date facilities, engineering and technical periodicals, test reports, etc. to serve the industrial information needs of the local industries.

Procurement (major items)

Major items under procurement are the following:

- Laboratory testing equipment for various products;
- · Laboratory furniture equipments;
- Production workshop equipments
- Sub-contract for specialized training in selected fields (advanced welding technology; testing procedures; etc.).
